Horizon's The Moncton Hospital is a level 2 trauma centre that includes tertiary care for neurosurgery, neonatal intensive care and maternal fetal medicine services. It serves as a referral centre for these tertiary services and other specialty services across New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island and northern Nova Scotia. The Moncton Hospital is among Canada's leading centres for neurosurgery, neurology and active advanced-stage oncology (cancer) services and is home to the NB Child and Adolescent Psychiatric Unit and The NB Organ and Tissue Program. The Moncton Medical Education Program, affiliated with Dalhousie University and Memorial University of Newfoundland, and the following fully accredited teaching programs are administered through The Moncton Hospital: Dietetic Internship Program, the School of Radiologic Technology and Research, and the Pharmacy Residency Program. The area's health services cover a catchment population of approximately 192,000 people. The Moncton Hospital has an operating budget of approximately \$270 million, close to 3,000 staff, 112 physicians and 213 volunteers.

IMPROVEMENTS UNDERWAY

ACHIEVEMENTS

- Installation of digital screens throughout the hospital to improve communication with patients and the public
- Installation of exterior Horizon Health Network hospital signage
- Newly renovated post operative waiting room for families/loved ones

CHALLENGES

- Increasing alternate level of care (ALC) admission rate, coupled with a lack of nursing home care availability, leading to overcapacity and high occupancy rates
- Ongoing nursing recruitment efforts in a competitive environment
- ER overcrowding/triage level 3 wait times
