OUR VISION ...

SCCR offers a variety of specialized assessment and intervention services to clients with complex disabilities from all parts of the province. The programs provide highly specialized inpatient services, day patient services and specialty clinics, in both official languages. The centre offers support to therapists who are providing primary and secondary services via consultation and professional education opportunities. Research and provision of information/services to consumers are also essential components of the tertiary program.

OUR GOAL

Our goal is to maximize independence and self care for people with neurological disorders. We strive to provide excellence and leadership in patient care, research and teaching.

At SCCR, rehabilitation is about working with each individual patient and family to reach their highest level of independence and quality of life.

The patient and their family/caregivers are an important part of the team. They participate in goal setting and treatment planning.



WHAT WE OFFER

Inpatient Services:

This is our core service on the Adult Team and includes 20 inpatient beds available for individuals who require highly specialized (i.e. tertiary) services. Following admission, inpatients receive daily interdisciplinary treatment and are seen regularly by a physician. There is at least one family conference and each patient's progress is reviewed at a weekly meeting.

A detailed treatment plan is established and interventions are directed toward achieving the goals of the client and the team. Plans for discharge begin early and continue throughout the patient's stay.

Transitional Living Suites (TLS):

These accessible and self-contained living spaces on site at SCCR are designed for patients requiring intensive assessment and/or rehabilitation but who do not require intensive nursing care.

Outpatient Services:

We offer some single service outpatient services as well as specialized outpatient clinics, including one for Neuromuscular Disorders, and one for Orthotics.

Therapeutic Park

In the fall of 2010, we will be pleased to open Atlantic Canada's first therapeutic park, a place where patients of all ages can practise their independence skills in the fresh air.

We strive to use the latest available technologies to provide rehab services at a distance in order to best serve our patients around the province.
