• Staffing Shortages and its Impact on Services

M. Melanson provided an update regarding nursing staff shortages across Horizon and the impact this has had on services. The shortage of nurses has led to closures, reduced hours and hospital beds in some of the Horizon's facilities. In some cases, services in one area of a hospital have been impacted due to limited resources being redeployed to work on COVID-19 and intensive care units.

Other nursing staff constraints involve staff on sick leave, maternity leave or COVID-

19 related reasons. It was noted that the nursing shortage is nation wide and many other opportunities exist offering large financial incentives.

There is no indication of quality/safety of care at the point of patient care being impacted at this time, due to the current measures being taken .

A recruitment and retention strategy has been developed to address the ongoing situation focusing on campus recruitment, hiring of registered nurses, and internationally educated nurses (IENs).

#### • Mental Health Review

The government's <u>Inter-Departmental Addiction and Mental Health Action Plan: Priority Areas for 2021-2025</u> added 21 recommendations to supplement the addictions and mental health crisis response continuum. The recommendations address how regional health authority staffing, education, training, processes and procedures can be supplemented to better support crisis response in the province. The Horizon Addictions and Mental Health Services team led by Jean Daigle, VP Community Services are overseeing this this work in Horizon.

Action: J. Daigle will be invited to a future meeting to provide an overview of this work.

### Adverse Event Follow-up Process

M. Melanson asked the Council to provide advice of how Horizon could improve the follow-up process with families after an adverse event occurs in hospital. This topic will be brought forward to the next meeting and PEAs are asked to prepare suggestions for discussion.

### Surgical Wait Times

The Surgical Wait times red phase back-log is caught up, but the wait times remain the same as pre-COVID.
